Terms and Conditions of Play

1. 16th Chandigarh Junior/Sub Junior Golf Championship- 2023 is open to Junior/Sub Junior (Boys/Girls) in the Tricity with Age & Handicap criteria based on IGU instructions as given below. As a proof of age, birth certificate issued by Municipal Authorities or by a recognized school must be submitted to CGA for records.

2. The Draw shall be made at the sole discretion of the Championship Committee which can have players of different categories playing in the same group.
3. The Tournament shall be conducted for ONE day on Stroke Play format in accordance with the Rules of Golf as approved by the R & A. The playing rounds are as under:

Cat B All	18 Holes
Cat C All	18 Holes
Cat D All	18 Holes
Cat E All	09 Holes
(All = Boys and Girls)	

The Tournament committee reserves the right to curtail the number of holes due to any adverse situations / playing conditions.

4. Entries & Registration

- a. Entry form is available at our website www.cgaonline.in, Chandigarh Golf Club & CGA Golf Range. The entry form duly completed along with proof of age & entry fee are to be submitted at CGA Golf Range, Sector 6, Chandigarh 160019. By 02/06/2023.
- b. The Entry Fee for this tournament is Rs. 2000/- to be paid in Cash/Cheque/D.D In favour of “Chandigarh Golf Association”.

5. Draws

Draws for this event will be posted at the CGA Golf Range, Chandigarh Golf Club and Panchkula Golf Club notice boards, one day prior to the tournament. Draw will also be posted at our website. The Player must tee off at the time established by the committee.

6. Starting and Ending Round:

a) When to start Round

A player's round starts when the player makes a stroke to start their first hole.

The player must start at (and not before) their starting time:

- This means that the player must be ready to play at the starting time and starting point set by the committee.
- A starting time set by the committee is treated as an exact time (for example, 09:00AM, not any time until 09:01AM).

If the starting time is delayed for any reason (such as weather, slow play of other groups or the need for a ruling by a referee), there is no breach of this Rule if the player is present and ready to play when the player's group is able to start.

Penalty for Breach of Rule: Disqualification, except in these three cases:

- **Exception 1** – Player Arrives at Starting Point, Ready to Play, No More Than Five Minutes Late: The player gets the **general penalty** applied to their first hole.
- **Exception 2** – Player Starts No More Than Five Minutes Early: The player gets the **general penalty** applied to their first hole.
- **Exception 3 – Committee Decides that Exceptional Circumstances Prevented Player from Starting on Time:** There is no breach of this rule and no penalty.

b) When Round Ends

A player's round ends:

- In match play, when the result of the match is decided under Rule 3.2a(3 or (4) of R&A Rule Book.
- In stroke play, when the player holes out at the final hole (including correction of a mistake, such as under Rule 6.1 or 14.7b of R&A Rule Book.

7. Ties

In the event of a tie for the 1st Place, there will be a "sudden death" play off in all categories. Other ties will be decided based on the lowest score over the last 18, 9, 6, 3, & 1 holes, respectively.

8. Tournament Committee

- a. The Tournament Committee will be formed by the President, CGA.
- b. The Tournament Committee will have the sole discretion to interpret the conditions for the competition and give decisions on any query / ruling / disputes arising during the conduct of the tournament.
- c. Any matter not covered under the conditions of play will be decided by the Tournament Committee and their decision shall be final and binding on all the participants. The Tournament Committee reserves the right to fix / alter starting times. In the event of any Round/s being cancelled due to inclement weather or for any other reason, the tournament Committee shall assess the situation and take a decision which shall be binding on all the participants.

9. Use of Caddies

- a. All participants are permitted to use caddy during the tournament. Parents/relatives/friends/coaches are not allowed to caddy. Caddy fee is Rs.500/- for 18 holes and Rs. 300/- for 9 holes will be paid by the participants.

10. Tournament Tees

Following Tees will be used:-

Category "A" & "B" (Boys)	Blue Tees
Category "A" & "B" (Girls)	White Tees
Category "C & D:	(Boys & Girls) Red Tees
Category "E"	(Boys & Girls) Orange Tees

Tournament Committee is empowered to use its discretion to decide the Tees in case of adverse / favourable playing conditions.

11. Dress Code

It is the duty of the player to find out the Dress Code of the host club and wear the same. Failure to follow the Dress Code of the host club may result in the Players not being allowed to play. In addition to the dress code of the host club following dress code must be adhered to:-

12. Prompt Pace of Play

A round of golf is meant to be played at a prompt pace.

Each player should recognize that their pace of play is likely to affect how long it will take other players to play their rounds, including both those in the player's or group and those in following groups.

Players are encouraged to allow faster groups to play through.

- a) **Pace of Play Recommendations.** The player should play at a prompt pace throughout the round, including the time taken to:

- Prepare for and make each stroke,
- Move from one place to another between strokes, and
- Move to the next teeing area after completing a hole.

A player should prepare in advance for the next stroke and be ready to play when it is their turn. When it is player's turn to play:

- It is recommended that the players make the stroke in not more than 40 seconds after they are (or should be) able to play without interference or distraction, and
 - The players should usually be able to play more quickly than that and is encouraged to do so,
- b) Playing out of turn to help pace of play. Depending on the form of play, there are times when players may play out of turn to help the pace of play:
- In match play, the players may agree that one of them will play out of turn to save time.
 - In stroke play, players may play "ready golf" in a safe and responsible way
- c) Single round of completion (18 Holes) timing will be four hours and fifteen minutes. Slow play will be penalize as per rule. (This refers to para 8 of the CGC Local Rules)

13. Drug Abuse

Competitors shall not make use of any drug to enhance his / her performance.

14. Practice Round - No Practicing Round is allowed.

15. Use of Mobile / Electronic Gadgets

Use of mobile phone or any electronic gadget is not allowed during the stipulated round of golf. During the tournament only distance measuring (BMB) devices are allowed. Penalty-**Disqualification.**

16. Spectators Policy –

- a. All Spectators must be on the Cart Path at all times.
- b. Minimum 50 Yards distance has to be maintained from the players at all times.
- c. No communication is allowed with the player or caddy except at crossover to handover refreshment.
- d. Use of mechanized Golf Carts by audience is not allowed during the tournament.
- e. Anyone seen violating these rules will be asked to leave the course and remain in the club house thereafter.

17. Prizes

Each Category (boys and girls) will be awarded Winner, 1st Runners up and 2nd Runners up Trophy. Special Prizes (Longest Drive and Nearest to Pin).

18. Prize Distribution

Prize Distribution will take place on 05/06/2023 at CGA Golf Range after the game.

19. Discipline

Following procedure will be followed in cases of indiscipline during the tournament:-

- a. The Tournament Committee will take cognizance of a complaint on a player made by a fellow competitor, referee, marker, observer; member of the gallery etc. provided it is in writing.
- b. The Tournament Committee shall give the player an opportunity to present his / her version of the incident/s.
- c. The Tournament Committee then in consultation with the Tournament Chief Referee, shall decide on the penalty to the player which shall not exceed disqualification.

20. Markers for D&E will be provided by CGA at its discretion and their score will be final. However players will also note down their own score.

21. Refreshments to Participants- Refreshment will be provided to participants only. Parents/relatives/friends/coaches to make their own arrangements for meals and refreshments.

22. RECORDING OF SCORES

Each player will be assigned as “Marker” to record the score of another player in the same group. The marker shall be responsible for recording the player’s correct score after each hole. After completion of the stipulated round, the player shall:-

- a. Check his Hole by Hole score for accuracy.
- b. Settle any doubtful points with the committee.
- c. Ensure that his marker has signed the score card.
- d. Counter –sign by him.
- e. Return the card to the Scorer/Recorder immediately after the completion of round.
- f. Any overwriting etc should be signed by the marker and the competitor.

Note: All participants are requested to submit their score cards to the recorders immediately after the completion of play. Scoring area is Gazebo at tee 10.
